Edwin Parr Nomination

Lakeland Catholic nominated St. Dominic Elementary School Kindergarten Teacher Alexandra Shapka for the Alberta School Boards' Association Edwin Parr Award.

Alexandra is a first year teacher who is dedicated to her students, is eager to expand her knowledge, build relationships with other staff, and share her faith.

She is active in her school as well as in division-based initiatives such as the Mental Health Matters Campaign Committee and the LCSD Collaborative Response Team.



Friends of Education Nomination

Action for Healthy Communities was nominated by Lakeland Catholic for the ASBA's Friends of Education Award.

The Edmonton-based not-for-profit serves local newcomer families through a Small Centres Team, which collaborates with LCSD English Language Learner (ELL) Lead Teacher Sherry Depner on running programming in schools in Cold Lake, Bonnyville, and Lac La Biche.

The organization helps support elementary school ELL students with building confidence and gives them the opportunity to make friends through after-school clubs, paint night events, and conversation clubs.

AHC works with Depner to build connections between high school ELL students through various activities such as curling, and their Virtual Filipino Youth Group.

Students Enjoying New Course

Assumption Jr/Sr High School Teacher, Peter Godin, has created locally-developed curriculum for a new Tabletop Roleplay Game Design Course.

The board approved the implementation of the course earlier this school year.

There are currently 24 students in the program, and it has received glowing feedback from those enrolled.
